

Spanish election day takes up all of HISPASAT's occasional use capacity

 The operator offered 330 hours of capacity via satellite Hispasat 1D's European connectivity

Madrid, 28 May 2014. Spanish telecommunications satellite operator HISPASAT provided the equivalent of 330 hours of occasional use over satellite Hispasat 1D's European connectivity, during the Spanish regional and municipal elections held this 24 May. This figure, contracted for the most part by providers Telefónica Broadcast Services and Overon, took up nearly all of the company's available capacity for occasional use over this connectivity.

This contracted capacity enabled the communications media to meet their direct connectivity needs, setting up a vast number of connections across Spain so that audiences could get all the election night news first-hand.

In addition to Europe-Europe connectivity (including North Africa and Israel), HISPASAT's satellite fleet also offers occasional use services over the Americas-Americas, Americas-Europe and Europe-Americas connectivities. With its privileged orbital positions at 30° West, 55.5° W and 61° West, HISPASAT can bridge the Atlantic in a single hop.
